

Minutes of 23rd meeting of the One Health Consortium

Venue: Virtual Mode, Groupwise meeting

Date and time: 4th March 2022, 11.00 am onwards

Dr Hegde welcomed the collaborators of different groups. A brief summary of points discussed in the meetings are as follows:

General: Memorandum of Agreement (MoA): Institutions were requested to submit MoA in Rs 100/ non- judicial stamp paper, as per DBT format, to NIAB at the earliest.

1. NIAB, NRC on Meat, Gandhi Medical College and NIVEDI Group:

- a. SOPs: NRC Meat informed that SOPs for two food-borne diseases have been prepared. Thus, sampling plan for all veterinary diseases is available for implementation.
- b. Tuberculosis diagnosis: Discussion on diagnostic test to be used both in human and bovine was held. Since a National Programme on human TB is already in place, it was suggested to examine zoonosis of bovine Tb in human subjects/contacts working closely with infected animal.
- c. Sampling plan for clinical diseases: This was discussed in length and it was suggested that effort should be continued to obtain statistical data from IDSP for the last 5 (if not, at least 2-3) years. However, initially sampling plan for 1st phase can be formulated based on hospital data/ earlier reports/ hotspots in which IDSP can be taken into account as and when available. Based on the results obtained in the first phase, robust data will be available for 2nd phase. This issue will be further discussed in medical group meeting for a common consensus and inputs from Dr Suresh and Dr Dhinakar Raj.
- d. Issue of sample collection was also discussed and investigators were advised to collect samples of different diseases from different villages.

2. MAFSU, AIIMS - Delhi and AIIMS - Jodhpur: AIIMS, Jodhpur made a presentation on SOPs for CCHF.


- a. SOPs for Q fever will be prepared by AIIMS, Jodhpur, as per the template provided by and in coordination with Dr. Nagmani.
- b. Dr. Saini along with Dr Kamran agreed to coordinate the compilation of SOPs.
- c. Concern was noted on slow progress in the medical group and to sort out various issues, a meeting in physical/hybrid mode was suggested at the earliest in a convenient place.

3. GADVASU and IVRI:

- a. Progress towards purchase of equipment and hiring manpower was noted to be none or minimal at IVRI. It was informed by IVRI investigators that they have a similar programme with overlapping diseases and investigators, and that internal deliberations were ongoing to decide about the possibility and mode of continuing participation in this consortium. It was also expressed that on-boarding wildlife experts from IVRI required a complex process. From the discussions with investigators and other stakeholders, it was not clear whether and how IVRI wishes continue in this programme.
